Visa Policy for Jordan



The visa policy of Jordan determines which countries do not need a visa to travel to the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan and who may enter the country without a visa. Visa requirements for entering Jordan vary depending on your nationality. Some countries require a visa, while others do not. Working hours (i)



All shops and restaurants are open every weekday (from Saturday to Thursday), from 10 am to 10 pm (most restaurants keep their doors open until 12 am). Friday is weekend in Jordan, but restaurants stay open from 10 am to 10 pm (most restaurants keep their doors open until 12 am). most other shops open after 2 pm on Fridays, some of the shops are closed the whole day.

Tipping in Jordan



Tipping in Jordan is not compulsory; however, you can tip a driver or bellboys and room cleaners if you like. Usually, tips are between 1-5 JOD based on the service.

Bedouin A

Electricity in Jordan ()





In Jordan, the power plugs and sockets are of type C, G. The standard voltage is 230 V, and the standard frequency is 50 Hz.

TAXI

Upon arriving to Jordan and when leaving Queen Alia International Airport to the Dead Sea where the conference is taking place you can book an airport special taxi (beige colour). The booth is placed outside the arrivals terminal and will cost 35 Jordanian Dinar which can be paid in cash or with credit cards.

Please note when leaving the airport, you will not be able to use regular taxis (yellow colour) or any of the transportation apps.

When leaving your hotel for Queen Alia International Airport, you can book your trip by contacting the concierge office in your hotel lobby. The available transportation is a private ride based on the type of car:

These checkpoints, primarily for passport and ID verification, are typically efficiently managed, ensuring minimal disruption to your journey.




Location

Polished rooms provide free minibars and Wi-Fi, plus flat screens, tea and coffeemakers, and balconies or terraces; some have views of the Dead Sea. Suites add living areas and/or outdoor whirlpool tubs. Room service is available.

There are 3 bars and 4 restaurants, including a Thai eatery and a pizzeria; some have sea views. Other amenities include 9 outdoor pools and a high-end spa, plus a gym and a tennis court.

The average temperatures are between 20°C (69°F) and 26°C (78.8°F).

There shouldn't be any rainy days in the Dead Sea during November.




HASHEMITE KINGDOM OF JORDAN

JORDAN'S HISTORY

Jordan is a land steeped in history.it has been home to some of Humankind earliest settlements and villages, harbouring hidden relics from the world great civilizations.

As the crossroads of the Middle East, the lands of Jordan and Palestine have served as a strategic nexus, connecting Asia, Africa, and Europe. Since the dawn of civilisation.

Jordan's Geography has given it an important role as conduit for trade and communications; connecting the orient with the west. Jordan continues to play a critical role in geopolitical affairs.



AMMAN - THE CAPITAL

Amman, the capital of Jordan is a fascinating city of contrasts-a unique blend of old and new, situated on a hilly area between the desert and the fertile Jordan Valley.

In the commercial heart of the city, ultra -modern buildings, hotels, restaurants, art galleries and boutiques rub shoulders comfortably with traditional coffee shops and tiny artisan workshops.

Amman's neighbourhoods are diverse and range in cultural and historical context from the hustle and bustle of the downtown markets to the art galleries of Jabal Al Weibdeh and the modern shopping district of Abdali.



DEAD SEA

A spectacular natural wonder, the Dead Sea is perfect for religious tourism and fun in the sun with the family. With its mix of beach living and religious history you can soak up the sun while Biblical scholars can get their daily dose of religious history.

The leading attraction at the Dead Sea is the warm, soothing, super salty water itself – some ten times saltier than sea water, and rich in chloride salts of magnesium, sodium, potassium, bromine, and several others. The unusually warm, incredibly buoyant, and mineral-rich waters have attracted visitors since ancient times, including King Herod the Great and the Egyptian Queen, Cleopatra. All of whom have luxuriated in the Dead Sea rich, black, stimulating mud and floated effortlessly on their backs while soaking up the water healthy minerals along with the gently diffused rays of the Jordanian sun.



MA'IN HOT SPRINGS

Hammamat Ma'in mineral springs and waterfall are located 35 kms southwest of Madaba on the edge of Wadi Mujib, 264 meters below sea level.

The mineral-rich waters come from over 100 hot and cold springs and empty into the Dead Sea. Heated underground by lava fissures, the thermal water temperature can reach as high as 63°C as it bubbles out of the ground and cascades down the mountain in a series of waterfalls.

Hammamat Ma'in continues to attract large numbers of people seeking treatment for aid blood circulation, skin diseases and rheumatism.



THE BAPTISM SITE / BETHANY BEYOND THE JORDAN / AL-MAGHTAS

Home to several biblical cities including Sodom, Gomorrah, and Zoar, the archaeological discoveries between the Jordan River and Tal al-Kharrar have identified this area as Biblical "Bethany Beyond the Jordan."

The area is where John was living when he baptised Jesus. Designated as a UNESCO World Heritage site, the Baptism Site commission welcomes pilgrims from all around the world seeking spiritual connection to biblical times, a glimpse of history or a chance to be baptized where Jesus was so many years ago. If that's not enough biblical history for one area, the cave where Lot and his daughters took refuge after the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah is located just outside an area called Safi (Biblical Zoar). This site is one of Jordan's UNESCO world heritage sites.



WADI RUM

"The Valley of the Moon", depicted as Mars in several Hollywood feature films Wadi Rum is an Arabian fairy-tale waiting to be discovered. Home to nomadic Bedouin tribes, Wadi Rum is a quiet getaway of stars, sand, and sun, a perfect complement from Amman's epicentre.

Once inhabited by the Nabataeans of prehistoric times, Wadi Rum allows you to get lost in large landscapes and horizon lines.

The calmness of the desert is sure calm your spirit and de-clutter your thoughts. Wadi Rum is waiting for you. This site is one of Jordan's UNESCO world heritages sites.




PETRA

The ancient city of Petra is one of Jordan's national treasures and by far its best-known tourist attraction.

Petra is the legacy of the Nabataeans, an industrious Arab people who settled in southern Jordan more than 2,000 years ago. Admired then for its refined culture, massive architecture and ingenious complex of dams and water channels, Petra is a UNESCO World Heritages Site and one of the new Seven Wonders of the World.

Inhabited by the Nabateans, Edomites and Romans, Petra brought together the knowledge and skills of these civilisations to create this world wonder. Caravans laden with incense, silks, spices, and other exotic goods would rest at Petra. This site is one of Jordan's UNESCO world heritage sites.
